Type	Name	Description
Arugula	Rocket	21 days baby; 40 days full size. The standard salad arugula thrives in cool weather. Delicious salad green has a spicy flavor when mature. Long, dark green, lobed leaves are suitable for salads or bunching. White flowers with dark pink veins make attractive spicy additions to salad mixes. <i>Eruca sativa</i> .
Arugula	Wild, Dragon's Tongue	50 days. Dragon's Tongue will tempt you with its rich green leaves accented by stunning red veins and midrib. Its complex flavor is zesty and peppery. Wild arugula has a slightly stronger, more complex flavor than regular arugula. <i>Diplotaxis tenuifolia</i> .
Arugula	Wild, Rocky	40-50 days. Rocky is a fast-growing wild type arugula that grows in a compact rosette form. Wild arugula has a slightly stronger, more complex flavor than regular arugula. Flavor can be described as peppery or mustardy with a hint of nuttiness. <i>Diplotaxis tenuifolia</i> .
Basil	Cardinal	Tightly packed, cardinal red blooms are a striking addition to any herb garden. Strong, deep burgundy stems hold fragrant, tasty, bright green leaves. Vibrant and colorful throughout the summer. Also great for pesto. Height 24-30"
Basil	Italian Large Leaf	Large plant, 18-24" tall, 12-15" wide with medium-dark green leaves up to 3" long. Sweeter pesto type with high yields. Pinch back constantly (harvesting the leaves) to keep bushier with more production. Full sun, moist, rich soil. (Genovese)
Basil	Lemon, Mrs. Burns'	The best tasting lemon basil, with a sweet, tangy flavor. Very bright green, 2-1/2" long leaves with white blooms make this basil both attractive and intensely flavorful. Pinch off buds for bushier habit. Grows 18-24" tall.
Basil	Lime Basil	Heirloom. Lime flavor mixed with basil. 2" green leaves. Use for chicken, fish, salads, ice tea. Substitute for lemongrass in Asian recipes. 12-20" tall.
Basil	Sweet Thai	Thai basil is a popular herb in Southeast Asian cuisine and is a flavorful garnish served with Vietnamese pho (a savory broth of noodles and meat). It holds its flavor and texture better after cooking than other basil varieties and adds a kick to salads when sliced and eaten fresh. Sweet Thai's dark purple flowers and intoxicating scent make it a beautiful addition to the flower garden. A terrific container variety.
Cucumber	Crystal Apple	Heirloom. Small 3" oval fruit are bright, creamy white about the size of a small apple; sweet, mild and very tender. You can eat them skin and all. (65 days)
Cucumber	Japanese Long	Slim fruit that are very crisp and mild. Easy-to-digest, firm flesh with few seeds; very productive and delicious Japanese variety. (68 days)
Cucumber	Lemon	Unusual cuke is bright lemon yellow, round, and best when harvested at 2" across for either pickles or salads. Flavor is sweet, mild, never bitter, with an old-fashioned cucumber flavor with a hint of nuttiness. Heirloom (65 days)
Cucumber	Marketmore	Popular variety is a consistent producer of delicious, mildly sweet cucumbers with dark green protective skin. Highly disease-resistant and produce over a long season in hot or cool weather. A selection from Marketmore 76. (60 days)
Cucumber	National Pickling	This is the pickling cuke that pickle growers asked for. High yielding, early fruiting on vigorous, medium vines. Retains quality over a long season. Dark green fruit can be picked small at 2"-3" long for gherkins or larger at 5"-6" long for full sized pickles (52 days)
Cucumber	Richmond Green Apple	Unique heirloom from Australia. Fruits are the size of a lemon but are a beautiful light green color. Very mild, sweet and juicy. Hard to find and fun to grow. (70 days)
Cucumber	Spacemaster	Compact cucumber ideal for containers. Short hardy vines produce slender, dark green fruits 7.5" long. Prolific and great in salads or plain. Height 6-8"; spread 26". (56 days)
Cucumber	Striped	Heirloom. Introduced from Armenia to Italy in the 1400's. This unusual and attractive 12"-18" cucumber is always sweet and crispy, even when fruit is large. Thin-skinned, green with ridges has a dense flesh, few seeds, and a pleasant, mild flavor. Also known as the Painted Serpent. Handle carefully to avoid bruising. (60-70 days)
Eggplant	Behold Hybrid	Violet-purple fruits with white stripes, tender skin, very few seeds, and a very sweet, non-bitter flavor. Recommended for marinating or grilling whole. Fruit size: 4-8"; Height: 3-4 ft.; Spread: 30-35". (60 days)
Eggplant	Black Beauty	Popular heirloom variety. Glossy fruits become quite large, but are well shaped and perfect for thick slices for grilling. Harvest when fruit is shiny and before skin becomes dull. Harvest at about 6" long. (75-80 days)
Eggplant	Orient Express Hybrid	Outstanding early productivity. Attractive, slender, 8-10", glossy black fruits in the long Oriental style. Sets fruit in cool weather as well as under heat stress. Tender, delicately flavored, and quick cooking. Purple calyx. (58 days)
Eggplant	Purple Long	Prolific Italian variety. Heavily branched plants typically yield 4 or more dark-purple, cucumber-shaped fruit 8"-10" long. (85 days)
Flower	Amaranth, Tricolor (Perfecta)	The perfect plant for the back of the border display or grow it among ornamental grasses. The striking yellow and red bright foliage and tall, upright habit of this brilliant Summer Poinsettia make it a garden standout even in the back of the border! The upper third of the foliage is an intense display of red and yellow. Each Amaranthus plant is unique in its coloring, so plan on having several. Amaranthus Tricolor Perfecta is a somewhat narrow, column-shaped plant that reaches 36 inches tall and just 12 - 18 inches wide in the sunny garden. It is not afraid of damp soils and is a superb choice for waterside plantings. Few sights are as stunning as an Amaranthus flower garden.
Flower	Amaranth, Tricolor (Yellow)	This rapidly-growing annual is popular for its brilliantly yellow colored flower. Amaranthus Tricolor, also known as Joseph's Coat and Chinese Spinach, will reach 18 - 24 inches in height. The beautiful leaves are 3 - 6 inches long and 2 - 4 inches wide. To really attract attention, plant it in a mass grouping for stunning color! Amaranthus plants are ideal for sunny borders.
Flower	Calendula, Frost Princess	Lovely double creamy ivory flowers on plants 2 to 2.5 feet tall. Very tough plant, self-sows. Unique color makes this flower special. Full sun. Flowers spring to fall.

Flower	Calendula, Pink Surprise	Long a staple in European, particularly German cooking and an excellent saffron substitute, the edible petals of the Pink Surprise Calendula provide color and a peppery flavor to many rice dishes and soups, even teas. While completely edible, the center of this flower has a bitter taste so only the petals are generally eaten, fresh or dried. This easily grown, hardy annual shines when grown as a companion plant with other annuals or to complement the perennial garden. At 18 to 24 inches in height and approximately 18 inches of spread Pink Surprise holds its own, adding color to your borders and provides a striking contrast to your purple sage, larkspur and salvia. The lovely 2 to 3 inch blooms and strong stems make it an excellent candidate for both fresh and dried floral arrangements. Pink Surprise Calendula is extremely tolerant of most soil conditions, disease resistant and a wonderful way to attract bees, butterflies, lady bugs and other beneficial insects to your beautiful garden. A powerhouse of popular, Calendula is also a frequent resident in prized organic gardens. Pink Surprise Calendula thrives in coastal gardens or cottage flower beds and never fails to impress.
Flower	Cosmos, Cupcake	Cosmos bipinnatus, 4' tall, dark and light pink and white flowers, cut and come again flowers, deadheading produces more flowers. Wonderful new bowl shape with center pinwheel of smaller petals. Very, very cool. Easy and disease resistant
Flower	Dahlia, Harlequin Mix	Grandmother would have been proud of the eye-catching color and great profusion of bloom offered by this super-easy Dahlia! Harlequin Mix is a throwback to the old cottage garden days of bright, cheery mixed flowers, but there's nothing vintage about its bloom strength or garden vigor. This plant blooms heavily all summer, and the plant is so compact it's perfect for all your best flowerpots and windowboxes! The flowers are semi-double bicolors, most with a base petal color of rose, violet, yellow, orange, scarlet, or white, plus a "collar" of shorter petals of either ivory or butter yellow. Add a central cone of bright yellow and you've got one of the most colorful, eye-catching blooms in the garden! Measuring about 2½ inches wide, the flowers are held above the foliage, blanketing the plant when in full bloom. Just 12 to 14 inches high and wide, this plant is ideal for containers of all types as well as the front of the bed or border. Flower	Dahlia, Variability Dandy	The Dandy Mix produces dwarf, bushy flowers with little collars, and the flowers come in many shades of red, yellow, orange and white all with a white matching or contrasting inner collar of quilled petals.
Flower	Marigold, Mission Giant Yellow	Lively, lemon yellow chrysanthemum-like flowers sing your garden into summer with stunning large 3" double blooms. This reselected heirloom from the Burpee seed vault brings a bounty of brightness to the back of a perennial garden or indoors as a cut flower. GARDEN TIP: Remove spent blooms and fertilize regularly to promote fuller, more robust blooms.

Flower	Zinnia, California Giants	Zinnia elegans, name fits, 3' to 4' tall, giant 5" flowers, great producer

The short spreading vines produce abundantly. Fruit is ripe when the light brown papery husk has folded back to reveal the golden berry. Ripe fruit will soon fall to the ground. Open pollinated. (75 days)
Herb	Chives	Perennial. Versatile, medium-sized leaves. Mild onion flavor. Leaves are a key culinary herb, while the attractive globe-shaped blooms are used as an edible garnish. Plant is also ornamental. Height 12-18". Allium schoenoprasum
Herb	Cilantro, Calypso	50 days for leaves. Calypso is destined to become the new workhorse of your herb garden. Stocky, very well-branched plants deliver almost unbelievable yields of fragrant, delectable leaves, simply packed with authentic Cilantro flavor. Let them set seed and you have Coriander too! Just 12 to 18 inches high and wide, this powerhouse concentrates all its energy on producing masses of flavorful leaves. The more you cut, the quicker new ones arise, for a longer-than-ever season of delicious eating!
Herb	Dill, ProEasy	ProEasy Dill is a very dark-leaved, dense, feathery variety, upright yet compact enough for containers. Herb	Fennel, Green	Vigorous leaf production and sweet flavor, Nonbulbing type. We found Grostruchtiger to be the most flavorful fennel in our trials. Leaves are a nice addition to salads, coleslaw, and dressings. In addition to great flavor for us, the leaf fennel is the host plant for the swallowtail butterfly.
Herb	Oregano, Greek	Perennial. Heavy oregano aroma. Characteristic dark green leaves with white flowers. Excellent flavor and very hardy in the garden. 12-18" tall. Origanum vulgare hirtum.
Herb	Parsley, Italian Flat Leaf	Italian heirloom. Hardy biennial likes full sun or partial shade. Exceptionally large, flat glossy leaves with a sweet and mellow flavor. Height 12-18".
Herb	Sorrel, Red-Veined	30-50 days. Red-veined sorrel is a must-have for your vegetable patch, and it's ready before you know it -- pick the sweet apple-green-and-maroon leaves young for best texture and flavor. Yum! Red-veined sorrel has a tart, sharp flavor, much stronger than you would expect from its small size and innocent apple-green freshness. Running up the central vein (the "midrib") and radiating outward into the leaf is a dash of maroon-red, very showy and bright. Talk about plate appeal! This delectable green is a terrific addition to soups, stews, egg dishes, and more. Pick it as young as you like -- if you wait too long, it will become tough. Even when young, it has a nice crispness that contrasts with the ultra-soft feel of the top of the leaf. A very interesting green!
Kale	Scarlet	Heirloom. Beautiful purple-red kale with frilly leaves that are delicious in a salad or use the plant as an edible landscape specimen. Very cold tolerant and tastier after a frost. (50-60 days)
Kale	Starbor Hybrid	For "one-cut" harvest. The finely curled, dark blue-green leaves can be harvested with one cut instead of being stripped off the plant individually. The compact plants produce leaves that are very uniform, resist yellowing, and have good flavor. Perfect for harvesting the whole plant at 12-18". Exceptionally cold tolerant. (55 days)
Kale	Tuscan (Lacinato)	Italian heirloom. Lacinato or "dinosaur" type. Unique leaf type noncurled but heavily blistered (savoyed). Rich, tender leaves have a softer texture than curly green kales. Tolerant of hot and cold weather. Brassica oleracea. (30 days baby; 65 days mature)
Melon	Ambrosia Cantaloupe	A top selling cantaloupe. Luscious, extra-sweet, and juicy with a delectable aroma. 6" melons average 5 lbs. each. Vines are resistant to powdery mildew and yield bumper crops. (86 days)
Melon	Athena Cantaloupe	An early-maturing cantaloupe renowned for its firm, aromatic, absolutely delicious flesh, Athena Hybrid is the gardeners' favorite for dependable performance and great holding power on the vine. This is a melon you don't have to rush to harvest, and every 5- to 6-pound fruit is super sweet, succulent, and delicious! The vine spreads between 2 and 3 feet long, setting about 5 to 7 melons. Athena Hybrid is such an early bearer that you might want to plant seeds successively every two weeks for a month or more, guaranteeing yourself of a summer-long harvest. The fruit arises with coarse netting and salmon-colored flesh on vigorous plants that know how to withstand garden stresses. The fruit keeps its texture and flavor for a long time after maturity, remaining true on the vine even if you can't harvest it immediately. Resistant to cracking and very durable, it's a gardener's dream!
